Being Ready means...



Removing Their Barriers









Now if it is valid to argue from effect to cause, then there are other attributes about this Creator that he/she must possess other than being an infinitely power.

For example since we are a moral effect, we know our Creator must be moral also. Since you and I are intelligent, we know our Creator must be intelligent. 

This God is identical to the God described in the Bible, a Theistic God



- 3. Background radiation echo





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




Evidence for Acts by A.D. 62

- 1. No mention of Fall of Jerusalem--70 A.D.
- 2. No reference to the Jewish War--66 A. D.
- 3. No hint of Nero's persecutions--c. 65 A.D
- 4. Apostle Paul is still alive--c. 65 A.D.
- 5. Apostle James is still alive--c. 62 A.D.

Note: Josephus recorded James' death at 62 A.D. (Antiquities, 20.9.1).

It is like writing the life of President Kennedy without mentioning his assassination (in 1963)."

Evidence for Early NT Authorship

- 3. Luke was written before Acts (thus by 61 A.D).
- 4. Most critics date Mark earlier than Luke (thus by 60 A.D.).


5. Even critical scholars agree that 1 Cor. was written by 55-56 A.D.

All this was during the life of eyewitnesses!

Ten Good Reasons for Reliability of the NT:

- 1. The manuscripts were copied accurately.
- 2. There were nine different authors of 27 books.
- 3. Their works were based on eyewitness testimony.
- 4. Early accepted Pauline Letters confirm its message.
- 5. There was no time for myth to replace basic facts.
- 6. The nature of the records is authentic.
- 7. Noted Roman historians have confirmed it.
- 8. Noted legal experts have vouched for it.
- 9. Numerous archaeological finds supported it.
- 10. Non-Christian sources support their message.

Even if every copy of the New **Testament was** destroyed, we could still paint a pretty accurate picture of Jesus' life just based on the information from secular sources!



Non-Christian Sources for the NT

F. F. Bruce, Jesus and Christian Origins Outside the NT.

- (1) Jesus was from Nazareth.
- (2) He lived a virtuous life.
- (3) He performed unusual feats.
- (4) He introduced new teaching contrary to Judaism.
- (5) He was crucified under Pontius Pilate.
- (6) His disciples believed He rose from the dead.
- (7) His disciples denied polytheism.
- (8) His disciples worshiped Him.
- (9) His teachings and disciples spread rapidly.
- (10) His followers believed they were immortal.
- (11) His followers had contempt for death.
- (12) His followers renounced material goods.

Story of Jesus from secular writers

"Jesus lived during the time of Tiberius Caesar. He lived a virtuous life. He was a wonder worker. He had a brother named James. He claimed to be the Messiah. He was crucified under Pontius Pilate. An eclipse and an earthquake occurred when he died. He was crucified on the eve of the Jewish Passover. His disciples believed that he rose from the dead. His disciples were willing to die for their belief. Christianity spread rapidly as far as Rome. His disciples denied the Roman gods and worshiped Jesus as God."

 Only 5% of the New Testament has been even questioned as a textual variant.

"Most modern textual critics can agree on the bulk of the text (some 95 per cent of it, perhaps). It is the remaining 5 per cent or so where disputes occur and differing conclusions may be found."

Percent of Accuracy of the NT

Even Critic Bart Ehrman admits: "In fact, most of the changes found in early Christian manuscripts have nothing to do with theology or ideology. Far and away the most changes are the result of mistakes pure and simple—slips of the pen, accidental omissions, inadvertent additions, misspelled words, blunders of one sort of another" (Misquoting Jesus, 55).


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


A few things to remember about the Resurrection of Jesus!



The Four Facts Are:

- 1. Jesus died by crucifixion.
- 2. He was buried in a tomb that was found empty three days latter.
- 3. Something happened to convince a large number of his disciples that he had resurrected from the dead.
- 4. His disciples (who knew him the best) were willing to die for their belief that Jesus appeared to them.



Evidence for The Resurrection

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, 5 and the appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. ⁷ Then be appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. (1 Cor. 15:3-8)

So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, so that each may receive what is due for what he has done in the body, whether good or evil (2 Cor. 5:9-10).









A Perspective To Remember

- The more we realize our sinful condition apart from Christ, the more we will realize the degree in which we have been forgiven.
- The degree in which you and I realize we have been forgiven a great debt will be the degree in which through God's power we will be able to love in return.
 - This love will translate into having a great desire to serve God.



What was God's ...? We also need to keep in mind that whatever God has called us to do, we must do it in His strength not our own.

What Was God's Plan From The Beginning?

8 And they heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the Lord God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the Lord God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" (Gen. 3:8-9)



God's Plan From The Beginning...

And God blessed them (Adam and Eve). And God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply and fill the earth and subdue it, and have dominion over the fish of the sea and over the birds of the heavens and over every living thing that moves on the earth. (Gen. 1:28)



God's plan had a snag!

What was God's concern with Adam and Eve, even before the Fall?

Why did God allow Satan to tempt Adam and Eye?

What good purpose could that have possibly served?

Why Should God Permit Any Evil?

LOVE *is the greatest good.*

LOVE <u>requires free choice.</u>

FREE <u>implies possibility of the opposite</u> <u>choice.</u>

GOD <u>alone is love, the greatest good.</u>

GREATEST good for humanity is God's love.

GREATEST evil for humanity is rejecting God.

Why Should God Permit Evil?

TO STOP evil is to stop free choices.

TO STOP *free choices is to stop love.*


TO STOP *love is to stop the greatest good.*

TO STOP the greatest good is the greatest evil.

<u>Question</u>:

Did we really want God to never permit the possibility of evil ?

Do we really want God to stop our evil?



What Was God's Plan From The Beginning?

God's Plan From The Beginning

²⁴ He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field, ²⁵ but while his men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat and went away. 26 So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared also. ²⁷ And the servants of the master of the house came and said to him, 'Master, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then does it have weeds?' 28 He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' So the servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' 29 But he said, 'No, lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. ³⁰ Let both grow together until the harvest, and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, "Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn." (Matt. 13:24-30)

God's Plan From The Beginning

³⁶ Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." 37 He answered, "The one who sows the good seed is the Son of Man. 38 The field is the world, and the good seed is the sons of the kingdom. The weeds are the sons of the evil one, ³⁹ and the enemy who sowed them is the devil. The harvest is the end of the age, and the reapers are angels. 40 Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the end of the age.41 The Son of Man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all law-breakers, 42 and throw them into the fiery furnace. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.43 Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear. (Matt. 13:36-43)

Why was God's plan for redemption for mankind so critical to restore our intimate fellowship with Him?


Because God could not forgive us without us being declared righteous.

God's Plan of Redemption


But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. Since therefore, we have now been justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God. Rom. 5:8-9





God's Plan of Redemption Was For What Goal?

2 Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is. (1 Jn. 3:2)



What Was God's Plan From The Beginning?

28 Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ 9 and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God that depends on faith— 10 that I may know him and the power of his resurrection, and may share his sufferings, becoming like him in his death,11 that by any means possible I may attain the resurrection from the dead. (Phil. 3:8-11)

Because God's plan after the fall was our redemption, His goal for us in this life was not to maximize our happiness.

God's plan was to bring about the knowledge of God in this life that brings happiness in the next life.


God's Final Plan

Why Was Pain and Suffering a Part of God's Plan For Us?

2 Count it all joy, my brothers,[a] when you meet trials of various kinds, 3 for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. 4 And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. (Js. 1:2-4)

Why Was Pain and Suffering a Part of God's Plan For Us?

3 Not only that, but we rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, 4 and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, 5 and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us.(Rom. 5:3-5)

What Was God's Plan ...?

And all who dwell on earth will worship it, (the beast) everyone whose name has not been written before the foundation of the world in the book of life of the Lamb who was slain (Rev. 13:8).

13 But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. 14 For he himself is our peace, who has made us both one and has broken down in his flesh the dividing wall of hostility15 by abolishing the law of commandments expressed in ordinances, that he might create in himself one new man in place of the two, so making peace, 16 and might reconcile us both to God in one body through the cross, thereby killing the hostility. 17 And he came and preached peace to you who were far off and peace to those who were near. (Eph. 2:13-22)

18 For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. 19 So then you are no longer strangers and aliens,[a] but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God, 20 built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, Christ Jesus himself being the cornerstone, 21 in whom the whole structure, being joined together, grows into a holy temple in the Lord. 22 In him you also are being built together into a dwelling place for God by[b] the Spirit.
