




"Disciplemaking is the process of bringing people into right relationship with God, and developing them to full maturity in Christ through intentional growth strategies, that they might multiply the entire process in others also."

Bringing people into right relationship with God.

"Biblical disciplemaking starts with responsible evangelism. And, I would argue, it must rightfully set its sights upon the evangelization of the nations."

2. Developing them to full maturity in Christ.

"This is what is meant by the equipping of the Body and the edification of the saints (Eph. 4:12). This also involves restoring the wounded and the hurting."

Deeper Things To Remember about Disciplemaking

"Disciplemaking is all about a certain kind of PERSON who is radically committed to a certain kind of PURPOSE and who, through a certain kind of PROCESS, reproduces a certain kind of PRODUCT."

A Certain Kind of PERSON

Three characteristics...

- "Authenticity in our worship of God,
- Brokenness in our walk with God and
- Courage in our work for God."







"When the discipler sommits himself or herself to becoming the right product (and reproducing that in the lives of others), things sort themselves out more readily."

Summary of Teaching on Discipleship

QUESTION?

When we get to the end of our life, what should have been our larger goal all through our life?

Answer: Our focus vertically and our focus horizontally (Our relationship with God and our relationship with others).

Our Vertical focus should be three:

- Loving God (THE GREAT COMANDMENT)
- Knowing God better and developing greater intimacy with Him.
- Becoming more like Christ.

- "..my flesh also dwells secure" (v.9). Security!

Our Horizontal Focus

Our Horizontal focus should be two:

LOVING YOUR NEIGHBOR

THE GREAT COMMISSION

Our VERTICAL focus should be to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength with the goal of knowing Him more personally and developing greater intimacy with Him and becoming more like Christ.

Our Horizontal Focus

Our HORIZONTAL focus should be to love our neighbor as yourselves (Mark 12:30-31) with the goal of helping them take a step closer to Christ and/or growing to be more like Christ.

Remember:

We can only truly love our neighbors the way we are commanded, if we have first experienced God's love and are increasingly changed by His love. (1 Jn. 4:18-19)

How Can We Ensure That We Will Keep The Right Focus Both Vertically and Horizontally?

1. Remember to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit.

- Let's first consider what it means to walk in the power of our flesh.
- ¹There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus, who^[] do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit.
- ³...He condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit. Rom. 8:1, 3-4 (NKJ).

How Can We Ensure That We Will Keep The Right Focus Both Vertically and Horizontally?

- 1. Remember to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit.
 - First consider what it means to walk in the power of our flesh.

1 And you were dead in the trespasses and sins 2 in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— 3 among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. (Eph. 2:1-3)

How Can We Ensure That We Will Keep The Right Focus Both Vertically and Horizontally?

- 1. Remember to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit.
 - Now let's consider what it means to walk in the power of the Holy Spirit.

16 But I say, walk by the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh (Gal. 5:16). 17 For the desires of the flesh are against the Spirit, and the desires of the Spirit are against the flesh, for these are opposed to each other, to keep you from doing the things you want to do.

 Remember To Walk in the Power of the Holy Spirit in All Your Relationships.

25 If we live by the Spirit, let us also keep in step with the Spirit. 26 Let us not become conceited, provoking one another, envying one another. (Gal. 5:25-26).

14 For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God (Rom. 8:14).

 Remember To Walk in the Power of the Holy Spirit in All Your Relationships

17 Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.18 And do not get drunk with wine, for that is debauchery, but be filled with the Spirit, 19 addressing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody to the Lord with your heart, (Eph. 5:17-19).

 Remember To Walk in the Power of the Holy Spirit in All Your Relationships

 - 2). Remember that idols can be things that we just develop an unhealth attachment to in some way.

Questions to ponder to determine if we have an unhealthy attachment to: Clear The Stage, by Jimmy Needham

Anything I put before my God is an idol.

Anything I want with all my heart is an idol.

And anything I can't stop thinking of is an idol.

And anything that I give all my love is an idol.

 - 3). An Idol can also be something that we become addicted to in order to experience some illegitimate pleasure and/or escape some difficulty reality or even mask some pain.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also <u>lay aside</u> every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us (Heb. 12:1).

Remember to reject idolatry in all shapes and forms.

Final Reminders:

- Remember that you cannot take refuge in God while "running after another!
- Choose to reject idolatry and pursue an allegiance and devotion to God - and discover that HE is our true refuge! Without this first starting point, everything else is futile.
- Remember that if God takes away the idols in our life, it's only because He wants to replace them with something better!
- Remember also that if we worship ourselves even a little...there is no room for true worship of God!

A Perspective To Remember
