We need to add Pre-Evangelism to our Evangelism.

Pre-evangelism = Cultivating Good Soil

 50% said they would talk to someone about faith who "<u>Does not force a</u> <u>conclusion</u>."

3. 43% said they would talk to someone about faith who "<u>Allows others to draw</u> <u>their own conclusions</u>."

WHAT IS A CERTAIN KIND ...?

One that uses an approach that is more conversational.

Why?

We live in a world in which people are reluctant to be told what is true!



WHAT IS A CERTAIN KIND ...?

- One that seeks to build spiritual bridges...

...to your unbelieving friends from the standpoint of their interest, not your own!

A friend of tax collectors and sinners Matthew 11:19, ESV

"The nail that sticks further out is the first that gets hammered down."

Topics for your neighbor co-worker or school friend.

Float a "spiritual balloon."







Topics for your neighbor or co-worker

 Find some kind of connection in your conversations with people that will make them want to hear more on spiritual topics!

WHAT IS A CERTAIN KIND ...?

 One that allows others to discover the truth for themselves by asking thought-provoking questions about what they say they believe.



How is it possible...?

... to believe that there is no God and yet believe in such non-material things as truth, love, beauty, and goodness?

Why Asking Questions is So Helpful?

"A person can close his ears to facts he does not want to hear, but if a pointed question causes him to form the answer in his own mind, he cannot escape the conclusion because it's a conclusion that he reached himself."

"Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water." (Jn. 4: 10 E.S.V.)



What is a Certain Kind of Evangelism ...?

- 1. One that uses an approach that is more conversational.
- 2. One that seeks to build spiritual bridge to your unbelieving friends from the standpoint of their interest not your own.
- 3. One that allows others to discover the truth for themselves by asking thought-provoking questions about what they say they believe.
- 4. One that remembers the Three D's of Conversational Evangelism.

In the same 2018 Barna poll, they revealed that...

...these same **Christian Millennials** said that they have confidence in sharing their faith! 73% say they know how to handle objections.

So, what should we conclude about these findings?

a certain kind of APOLOGETIC

But in your hearts honor Christ the Lord as holy, always being prepared (ready) to make a defensive to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect." 1 Peter 3:15 What is a Certain Kind of Apologetics?

One that understands the importance of "being ready."

The Greek word for ready (Hetoimos) is used in Matthew 24:44 and Luke 12:40 to communicate the idea that as Christians we need to anticipate Christ's return.






If we combine 1 Peter 3:15 with 2 Corinthians 10:5 and 1 Corinthians 9:22, it is clear that our responsibility is also to <u>eagerly</u> anticipate the questions and objections and remove barriers <u>whether others ask us a specific</u> <u>question or not!</u>



If we are going to be able to fulfill the imperatives of 1 Peter 3:15 in today's world, we must understand our responsibilities as being more than just giving answers if asked!


> We must eagerly work to remove their barriers!

Remember the four key facts that many non-believers will agree with Christians concerning Jesus' life.

Remember The Four Facts...

1. Jesus died by crucifixion.

2. He was buried in a tomb that was found empty three days latter.

3. Something happened to convince a large number of his disciples that he had resurrected from the dead.

4. His disciples (who knew him the best) were willing to die for their belief that Jesus appeared to them.

Jesus did three things to prove that He was God!


1. He lived a sinless and miraculous life.

If you can believe the big miracle, you can believe in the little miracles!



"How can you believe the Bible when it was written by so many different people who were imperfect?"

Here is the truth I want this young man to understand.

If you see the world through a theistic lens, the concerns you raise may be less difficult to answer than you think!

If God can do the big miracles...He certainly can do the little miracles!

"Would you agree that if there is A God who can create the universe, then He's powerful enough to ensure that what He wants to communicate to us reaches us, Even through imperfect people?"

His reply: "I would certainly see this issue as less problematic."





What is a Certain Kind of Apologetics...?

One that is selective in using an apologetic approach while being sensitive the work of the Holy Spirit.





Why?

Evidence alone will not help someone to welcome Christ!

The natural person does not <u>accept</u> the things of the Spirit of God, for they are folly to him, and he is not able to understand them because they are spiritually discerned. (1 Cor. 2:14)



You need the ministry of the Holy Spirit

65 And he said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father." (Jn. 6:65)



Remember also that non-believers do not reject Christianity because of the lack of evidence.

"Though he had done so many signs before them, they still did not believe in him," (Jn. 12:37).



Remember that non-believers primary barrier is not intellectual.



" They are darkened in their understanding, alienated from the life of God because of the ignorance that is in them, due to their hardness of heart." Ephesians 4:18 ESV



Implications







"Apologetics metaphorically can make the horse come to the water, but only the Spirit of God can help it to drink!"

Futher Implication

When you witness to someone, you should make sure they understanding that they have to make two decisions concerning Jesus.

One decision involves reason.

The other decision involves a step of Faith.



Another Implication

We should remind them that even after they get the evidence they were looking for, taking steps to the Cross may not be as easy as they think!



We should also be more strategic in how we go about using intellectual evidence for the truth of the Christian faith when we witness to others, if their primary barrier is never intellectual. We should also never give our skeptical friend the impression that we believe their biggest barrier to trusting Christ is intellectual.

We should never give up using apologetics in your witness to others?





For example It bothers me that I am not a better ______ to my (children/brother/sister) or a better ______ to my (spouse/parents).

PLANK TWO: I cannot measure up

 Now many of us feel this sense of alienation because of this separation from our Creator, but some of us may try to bring about greater reconciliation by doing good things to make up for our short comings.

 The problem is that no matter how much good we do...it is still not going to make a difference. Let me explain what I mean by this by giving an illustration.

RUSTANK TWO: I cannot measure up

Suppose you have done something to hurt your spouse, significant other, or good friend deeply. How can you reconcile with them? Can you do something very nice and sacrificial for their parents that will bring about a restored relationship? Obviously not.


 So why would we think that by doing good things for others that somehow that will help us in our relationship with our Creator?

Now if you and I have a standard of what is right and wrong and we don't live up to it, can you imagine that God's standard might be higher than our own?

"I am alienated From my Greator," 3rd Plank

We know that people like Mother Teresa and Gandhi did some good things in their life.





But we also know others that did some really evil things





"But I'll be honest with you...it's not just the evil in other people that bothers me. The evil in my own life **bothers me as well!** In fact, you don't have to look in the Bible to see what God says about me. Just ask my wife!"

PLANK THREE: I am a sinner

 The Bible teaches that our rebellion against God has caused a separation between God and us. (Rom. 6:23)

PLANK THREE: I am a sinner

 Now if our sins have to be judged, and we are not capable of changing our situation, what can we do?


Answer: We need to turn to an outside source.

(This then allows us to look for another way other than our own effort)



When you clean a dirty table, do you use a dirty or a clean cloth? • Would you agree that a dirty thing cannot clean itself?

 Would you agree that the only person who can clean away our sins must be perfectly clean himself? Did you know that Jesus was the only person in history who claimed to forgive sins and at the same time lived a sinless life Himself?



Christ's Unique Life

Not only was Jesus unique in living sinless life, he also gave evidence that he had power over death. Do you know how he did this?

Answer: By rising from the dead!

Christ's Unique Life

Do you know any other person in history who died, and came back to life and told us what was on the other side?

Do you know why it is so important for Christians that Jesus actually rose from the dead? (Rom. 8:11) Christ's Unique Life Answer: Because that same power that raised Jesus from dead is available to me to live a transformed life!
